Her main fields of research are general international law, human rights, international institutional law, international dispute settlement, legal theory, European law.

Before joining the Max Planck Institute she worked as a lecturer at the Université Catholique de Lille, Faculté Libre de Droit and at the University of Hamburg, Faculty of Law, and as a legal officer at the European Court of Human Rights.

She received her PhD from the University of Ljubljana and her master's degree in European and Comparative Law from the University of Oxford.
